COVID 19 Procedure

a) The Quebec health measures effective on March 31st, 2022 will be strictly enforced (if required: masks, hand sanitizing, distancing, etc.). The organizing committee will keep the competitors and teams aware of such by email, on its web site, Facebook page and on location. Such measures will be enforced from April 1st at 15:00 until April 2nd at 24:00.

b) Teams and officials will be informed of registration procedures on the Perce-Neige website and on-site registration (one team member only), sanitary measures to be observed for meetings (Novice, seed drawing, recce, officials, final briefing, etc.) and during the event (control, service area, etc.),

c) However, a full vaccination proof (or exemption) will be mandatory for all teams: driver, codriver and team members (up to 4).

d) The sanitary measures available from CARS at carsrally.ca/fr/documents/competitors will apply

7. Type of event

The **Rallye Perce-Neige de Maniwaki 2022** is a performance rally including 4 legs for a total distance of 516 km, with 15 stages (203 km). Most of the stage distance will be run on gravel roads, possibly covered with snow and ice. NRR 13,2,8 will not be valid.

Regional event A will consist of the first 2 legs (9 stages and 98 km).

Regional event B will consist of the last 2 legs (6 stages and 105 km).

8. Area

The Upper Ottawa Valley or Vallée de la Gatineau, Quebec

Elevation: Minimum 170 metres (559 feet)

Maximum 323 metres (1060 feet)

9. Entries

- a) Entries will be accepted until the end of the registration period on Friday, April 1st, 2022 at 19:00. See article 6 - Schedule.
- b) Eligible vehicles: Open 4WD and 2WD, Production 4WD and 2WD according to CARS 2019 rules. Competitors: Open to CARS license holders and those holding a CARS permit to compete. (See article 14)
- c) Any vehicle registered under another Sporting Authority and entered in a Canadian event will be admitted into a comparable CARS vehicle class according to CARS vehicle eligibility regulations. They will require a CARS permit to compete.

10. Maximum number of entries

The maximum number of entries will be 50. If more than 50 entries are received, entries will be determined on a "first paid / first served" basis (i.e., payment must be received before your entry is considered valid).

11. Entry fees

- b) The entry fees remain the same as in 2020 and include a road book, a service book, participation to the Nokian shakedown, 2 tickets for the Recce breakfast.
- c) The organizing committee is proud to include the **Rally Safe** system in the entry fees. It offers timing, press to pass, virtual triangle, virtual chicane and G force impact alarm.
- d) For the first time, an electronic route book and service book will be available for I-pads, computers and smart phones at registration, from March 31st.
- e) Cheques or money orders must be payable to CLUB RALLYE MANIWAKI and dated no later than the deadlines (Regular and Late) for the posted fees and be eligible for the starting order seeded draw. Please contact the registrar when you enter. INTERAC payment will also be possible.

- f) All registration procedures (waivers, full proof of vaccination, member to pick-up team package, etc.) will be conducted by email through the registrar (see section 1 COVID).
- g) Each entry fee includes a 140\$ CDN fee for public liability insurance, accidental death and dismemberment premium for insurance coverage during special stages. The insurance coverage limited to 5 million \$ is for both the event and competitors during competition on stages. While on transit, competitors are covered by their own insurance
- i) *Refund*: 100 % of the entry fee will be refunded if notice of withdrawal is given at least 48 hours prior to the opening of registration, Tuesday, March 29, 2022 at 15:00, There will be a 75% refund if notice is given within 48 hours of the opening of registration, March 31st at 15:00. After the opening of registration, no refund will be allowed.

12. Awards

Awards details will be posted at Headquarters. A ceremony with podiums will be held: CARS overall and 2WD. Overall RSQ. Overall OPRC. Overall ECRC,

13. Documents

a) **All forms needed are available on the Perce-Neige rally website.**

b) A pre-odometer check will be available at headquarters.

c) **Event sponsors decals will be provided to the teams and they will have to be put on the vehicles at the places determined by the organizing committee.**

14. Competitor Eligibility

All Canadian residents must hold a competition license delivered by CARS in order to enter *Rallye Perce-Neige de Maniwaki 2020*. Any competitor holding a competition license from another ASN must have a permit to compete from CARS, at a cost of 75.00 \$.

15. Timing and Scoring

a) Timing, controls and scoring will be as per CARS NRR – 15, 16 and 17. Timing cards will be used. They must be presented to control marshals at time controls. To calculate a time out at the end of a stage, the competitor will use the lateness time, unless the time spent in the stage is longer. If this should happen, the competitor will use the time in at the finish in hours and minutes.

Note: Competitors unfamiliar with this procedure are invited to attend a time-keeping refresher course which will be offered Friday April 1st, at 20:45.

b) Re-start order will be determined by the stage overall results, less the worst result as per NRR 15,3,2.

16. Service and refuelling

The service book will help plan service. It includes:

- A chart showing the total and stage distances between the start and each service stop.
- Information on predetermined service and gas stop areas
- Directions to access all stages start and finish points.
- Directions to access the optional refuelling areas
- GPS information for the majority of points of interest of the event

The distance between gas stops exceeds distances mentioned in NRR rule 13,2,7: However, refuel remote refuel opportunities can be used to meet these requirements.

There will be 3 service stops at a single location and an optional refuelling area in each leg.

- **This chart indicates the approximate distances between the refuelling and service.**

- Servicing and refuelling are strictly limited to the designated areas from the opening of the service area until the end of the event.

17. Parc Fermé and post-event scrutineering

All vehicles finishing the event must enter Parc Fermé. Upon reaching the finish control of the event, any team member may drive the vehicle into Parc Fermé. Any car finishing the event may undergo post event scrutineering. Dismounting and reassembling any parts will be the competitor's responsibility. Only volunteers, officials and medias wearing a CARS Series Media bib will be admitted in Parc Ferme. Competitors entering must be accompanied by an official; if otherwise, a penalty up to exclusion may be assessed.

18. RECCE Procedure

While a conventional route book will be provided, the clerk of the course will authorize a two-pass recce in all the rally stages on Friday, April 1st, 2022. During the recce, competitors may use their rally car. At the time of registration, competitors will determine which vehicle they will use for recce.

It is recommended to drive the recce with an AWD vehicle or a rally car. The clerk of the course keeps the right to disallow any inadequate vehicle for that activity.

Procedure for recce, according to GCR 13.6:

- The organization will supply a number that must be affixed to the top of the windshield on the co-driver side.
- The maximum speed is 60 km/h in the stages or the legal posted limit on transits.
- The organization reserves the right to have observation controls with radars during recce.
- Organizers may use Observation Controls when using radar locations. Competitors will stop at the control and the marshal will initial the stopped competitor's recce card and note the speed.
- Violation of 13.6.9 or 13.6.10 above will be penalized as follows:
 - (a) First offence: Up to 20 Km/h over, receive a warning.
First offence: between 21 - 39 km/h over, receive a \$150 fine.
 - (b) Additional offence/s: 11 - 20 Km/h over, receive an additional \$150 fine, for each occurrence.
Additional offence/s: 21 - 39 Km/h over, receive an additional \$300 fine, for each occurrence.
 - (c) Excessive speeds (40 Km/h or more) or competitors having a third offence above 20 Km/h: Competitors will be subject to referral to the stewards, by the organizer, for a hearing and possible exclusion, plus a \$300 fine added to those already accrued.
- All roads remain opened to residents, rally workers, school busses and logging trucks. Competitors are expected to share the roads.
- Teams are strictly forbidden to travel in the opposite direction in any special stage.
- A maximum of two passes of each stage will be allowed.
- No recce will be allowed outside the recce schedule, subject to exclusion from the event
- The recce schedule of the special stages will be available Friday March 25 by email and available on the official board

19. Tires

Quick reference on winter tires. if to be used:

- a) non-studded winter tires: FREE
- b) studded winter tires
 - must be DOT approved
 - if OE studded by manufacturer: FREE
 - if hand studded: MAXIMUM 130 STUDS WITH UP TO 3,5 MM PROTRUDING

CARS rule NRC 12,4,3 will apply for all teams entering *Rallye Perce-Neige de Maniwaki 2022*. Nokian Tyres offers a tire solution at very competitive prices. These tires comply with the CRC tire rule. To buy tires through this program, please contact:

All hand-studded tires to be used in the event must be scrutineered by the scrutineer when exiting the service area. More scrutiny may be conducted while the event is in progress.

Any team using hand-studded tires not already marked at scrutineering will be subject to penalties. The penalty for violation of the above studded tire regulations (CARS 17.2) is 10 minutes. In cases involving intentional circumvention of the studded tire regulations, sentence will be exclusion (CARS 7.9 (c)).

Any tire that does not fully comply with the ruling will be confiscated until Sunday morning. The eventuality of a refusal could cause disqualification.

20. Nokian Outpost Shakedown

The Nokian Outpost shakedown session will be offered FREE to all competitors (drivers, codrivers and team members only) on Friday, April 1st, 2022 from 18:00 to 20:30. Registration for this activity is mandatory before Friday April 1st 2022 at 17:30. The Nokian Outpost Shakedown will be according to CARS rule 13.7.

Cars entered in the Nokian Outpost shakedown will depart from the service area.

21. Miscellaneous

- a) All competitors are reminded that, with the exception of the official recce, any practising is prohibited (NRR 17.8.1),
- b) The official time will be posted next to the official notice board.
- c) Car rental is not available in Maniwaki. Closest rental offices are in Gatineau (130 km south) or Mont-Laurier (52 km east)
- d) **All competitors (Regional AND National) participating in an event that will be using RallySafe will be required to purchase and pre-install a RallySafe Permanent Installation Kit from the [RallySafe Store](#) This is a one-time purchase and install that stays with the car.**

The RallySafe fitting kit must be installed before the RallySafe unit is installed at scrutineering. Cars not meeting this requirement will not pass scrutineering.
